SCRIPTURE MEDITATION

(Jerry Galipeau, World Library Publications) Mark Today the Christmas season comes to a close with another epiphany of Jesus as God's beloved Son. The importance of Jesus' baptism is underlined in that the first three Gospels directly describe it,

and John's Gospel mentions it as having already happened. Why did Jesus need to be baptized? John the Baptist himself asks this in Matthew's account. Jesus responds by saying, "To fulfill all righteousness." Scholars interpret this remark as showing Jesus solidarity with sinners, those for whom he had been sent, even though he himself did not sin. The central moment occurs when Jesus is coming out of the water. The Holy Spirit descends upon him and, in Matthew only, the Father announces, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." More than a public service announcement for those present then, it proclaims to us now: Jesus is the Son of the Father. He will go from this event to be tempted in the desert, and then into his ministry of preaching, teaching, healing, and casting out demons. As we return to Ordinary Time, consider what tasks God has given to us.

Do you see your Baptism as rooting you in a life of service?

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

Saint Matthew's story of the baptism of Jesus is an appropriate scripture reading to reflect on our own

baptism. Jesus' baptism has been understood as a symbol of his death. Baptism is the sacrament by which we die to an old life of sin and enter a new life of grace. We "put on Christ." To be a good steward of one's baptism means to accept that one has new life in the risen Lord and is willing to be guided by the life of Jesus. As the new year begins to unfold, reflect on the meaning of your own baptism, and how you might make an even deeper commitment to a new life in Christ Jesus?
