

Parents must be members of the parish to have their children baptized. Parents baptizing their first child are required to attend all three classes.



The Catholic Messenger


Since January 1, 2017, St. Mary has received \$4,088.00 in subscriptions for the Catholic Messenger.

Easter is more than springtime and dyed eggs. The significance of Easter is that not only sin but death has been conquered by the risen Christ who foretold his own resurrection he gave his life for us on Good Friday.

The serpent's bite was a deadly one. The venom had worked its way deep into the heart of the entire human race, doing its gruesome work. The anti-venom was unavailable until He appeared. One drop was all that was needed, so potent was this antidote. Yet he poured out all he had, down to the last drop. The sacrifice of His entire life, poured out at the foot of the cross—the Son's answer to the Problem of Sin.

Three days later came the Father's answer to the Problem of Death. It was equally extravagant. For Jesus was not simply brought back to life like Lazarus. He passed over, passed through. Death, as St. Paul said, would have no more power over him.

You may say physical death was not the worst consequence of sin, and you'd be right. Separation from God, spiritual death, is much more fearsome. Our bodies and immortal souls are intimately intertwined, which makes us so different from angels and animals. Death separates what God has joined. Even the God-man trembled in the Garden.

Jesus confronts death head on, for our sake. "He descended into Hell" of the Apostle's Creed means that Jesus endured the wrenching of body and soul for our sakes and came out the other side endowed with a new, different, glorified humanity. Mary Magdalene did not recognize the Risen Christ at first, until He called her by name. The disciples on the road to Emmaus didn't recognize him either. We do not have words adequate to describe the awesome reality of the new humanity he has won for us.

For resurrection is not something that He intends to keep for Himself. All that He has he shares with us: His Father, His mother, His Spirit, His body, blood, soul, and divinity, and even His risen life. And we can begin to share in this Life now, experiencing its regenerating power in our souls and even in our bodies. We have access to it in many wonderful ways, but especially in the Eucharist. For the body of Christ that we receive is his Risen, glorified body, given to us so that we too might live forever (read John 6:40-65).

Each of us will have to pass through physical death, but not alone. He will be with us, just as the Father was with Him as He made his perilous passage. And while we will experience indescribable joy when our souls "see" him face to face, this is not the end of the story. He will return. And the resurrection will have its final and ultimate impact. Joy will be increased still further when he makes our bodies like his own, in glory. "I look forward to the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen!"

From Dr. Marcellino D'Ambrosio's book, 40 Days, 40 Days: A New Look at Lent

This is the Day the Lord has made, Let us Rejoice and be Glad!

Jesus, you are the risen Lord, and all creation sings you praise today!

I hear the very stones cry out, just as you said they would, "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!"

Today, the burial cloths come alive to declare your victory. Death has no hold on you, Lord. You broke free in a great burst of light, and left the burial cloths tidily behind.

Loving Savior, because of you, a cruel instrument of death now speaks to me of life. By your cross, you have destroyed the enemy and flung open the gates of salvation. Its light shines out—in our churches, in our homes, in hospital rooms, in the dark rubble of warfare, and in every dark and dreary place—proclaiming life to anyone who puts their faith in you.

So many transformed lives! So many signs of victory! Each one, in its own way, speaks to me of you. Help me to look, listen and believe so that, in my own way, I too may become a sign that speaks of you to the world.

You are risen, You are with us always.
May I be a sign of Your risen presence to
