



Divine Mercy: Message and Devotion



The message of The Divine Mercy is simple. It is that God loves us – all of us. And, he wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy.

The Divine Mercy message is one we can call to mind simply by remembering ABC:

- A Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world.
- B Be Merciful God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us.
- C **Completely Trust in Jesus**. God wants us to know that the graces of His mercy are dependent upon our trust. The more we trust in Jesus, the more we will receive.



This message and devotion to Jesus as
The Divine Mercy is based on the
writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, an
uneducated Polish nun who, in
obedience to her spiritual director,
wrote a diary of 600 pages recording
revelations she received about God's
mercy. Even before her death in 1938,
devotion to The Divine Mercy begun to
spread.

Our Lord to Sister Faustina (Diary Entry #687)



Sister Faustina was 1905 in Poland of a poor and religious family of peasants, the third of 10 children. She was baptized with the name Helena. From a very tender age she stood out because of her love of prayer, work, obedience, and a her sensitivity to the poor. At the age of seven she felt the first stirrings of a religious vocation. She entered the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in 1925, and took the name Sr. Maria Faustina of the Most


Externally nothing revealed her rich mystical interior life. Although her life was apparently insignificant and dull, she hid within herself an extraordinary union with God. The Lord Jesus chose Sr. Maria Faustina as the Apostle and "Secretary" of His Mercy, so she could tell the world about His great message, which she recorded in a diary titled *Divine Mercy in My Soul*. In the Old Covenant (Old Testament of the Bible) He said to her:

"I sent prophets wielding thunderbolts to My people. Today I am sending you with My mercy to the people of the whole world. I do not want to punish aching mankind, but I desire to heal it, pressing it to My Merciful Heart." (Diary, 1588)

Divine Mercy: The Diary & The Chaplet

The Diary of St. Faustina

The mission of St. Faustina was recorded in her *Diary* which she kept at the specific request of Jesus and her confessors. In it, she recorded faithfully all of the Lord Jesus' wishes and described the encounters between her soul and Him.




The Lord Jesus said to

who by reading these
things will be comforted in their souls and
will have the courage to
approach Me."
(Diary 1693)

The Divine Mercy Chaplet

In 1935, St. Faustina received a vision of an angel sent by God to chastise a certain city. She began to pray for mercy, but her prayers felt powerless. As she pleaded with God, she was given the words of the Divine Mercy Chaplet. Jesus asked her to share this form of prayer with others: Encourage souls to say the Chaplet which I have given you (1541). Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death (687). When they say this Chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as the just Judge but as the Merciful Savior (1541). Priests will recommend it to sinners as their last hope of salvation. Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this Chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy (687). I desire to grant unimaginable graces to those souls who trust in My mercy (687). Through the Chaplet you will obtain everything, if what you ask for is compatible with My will. (1731)
