

Gospel Meditation



"He summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two." This Sunday we read the first sending of the Apostles to preach, teach, and heal. For many of us, it can be easy to think we "just don't have enough" to be disciples and evangelists ourselves. We don't have enough education and training. We don't have enough experience talking to people about Jesus. We don't pray enough. We don't have enough faith.

If you look at the Apostles in today's Gospel reading, they didn't have much either. "No food, no sack, no money in their belts." They didn't plan out their itinerary or book their lodging in advance. From what we know of the Apostles, they were not the religiously trained and educated ones. They were fisherman, tax collectors, and political activists. But what does being a fisherman require? Someone like Peter needed a strong work ethic to rise at strange hours. He needed patient calm to wait for the catch. Once ashore, he needed a savvy mind to fetch a good price for his labors.

As Peter became a fisher of men, he would need diligence to persevere through the hard journeys, long days, and persecution that awaited him. He would need patient calm with those who disagreed with him. As the leader of the Apostles, he would need a savvy mind to navigate challenges facing the early Church. From one perspective, Peter has nothing to offer the mission of Jesus. Thinking more creatively, one can see that -- joined with faith and love -- perhaps Peter had everything he needed.

Jesus sends you as well. As you take stock of your own talents, consider how they might be offered as a gift to others. Maybe you already have more than enough.



How Our Parish Prays

From November, 2017 through April, 2018 Pope Francis gave a series of catechesis on the Holy Mass. This is the beginning of an eight part series to share his teachings with our parish—as we celebrate and remember why our church building exists.

The Holy Mass

Introduction to Series on the Mass

Given by Pope Francis on November 8, 2017

"Dear Brothers and Sisters, **Today we begin a new series** of catecheses, which will direct our gaze toward the "heart" of the Church, namely, the Eucharist. It is fundamental that we Christians clearly understand the value and significance of the Holy Mass, in order to live ever more fully our relationship with God.

"We cannot forget the great number of Christians who, throughout the world, in 2,000 years of history, have died defending the Eucharist; and how many, still today, risk their lives in order to participate in Sunday Mass. Jesus said to his disciples: "unless you eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink his blood, you have no life in you; he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day" (Jn 6:53-54).

"This witness challenges us all and calls for a response as to what it means to partake in the Sacrifice of Mass and approach the Lord's Table. Are we searching for that well-spring that "gushes forth living water" for eternal life?; that makes of our life a spiritual sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving and makes of us one body in Christ?

"In the forthcoming catecheses I would like to answer important questions about the Eucharist and Mass, in order to rediscover, or discover, how God's love shines through this mystery of faith. The Eucharist is a wondrous event in which Jesus Christ, our life, makes himself present. The Apostle Saint Thomas, sought to see and touch the nail wounds in Jesus' body, and desired to some way "touch" God in order to believe in him. What Saint Thomas asks of the Lord is what we all need: to see him, to touch him so that we may be able to know him. The Sacraments meet this human need. The Sacraments, the Eucharistic celebration in a particular way, are signs of God's love, the privileged ways for us to encounter him.

"Thus, through these catecheses that we are beginning today, I would like to rediscover with you the beauty that is hidden in the Eucharistic celebration and that, once revealed, gives full meaning to each person's life. May Our Lady accompany us on this new stretch of road. Thank you."
