Did you know that our parish hall's nursery has been serving families since 2006 with childcare, so young parents can engage in parish life, deepen their relationship with Jesus and foster a strong family unit through parish ministries.

Realizing they do not have extended family to help with childcare, our parish tries to provide this when serving their families with ministries such as **Little Lambs Nursery** during 10:30 Mass, the monthly **K-4**th **Grade Family Gathering Sunday** and the Saturday evening **Marriage On Tap.**

Gospel Meditation IN ORDINARY TIME "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" He said to him, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind." - Mt 22:36-37 Excepts from the Lectionary for Mass ©2001, 1998, 1970 CCD.

"The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments." Jesus gives us a simple moral principle in today's Gospel. He speaks about two kinds of love: love of God and love of neighbor. He tells us that all the other laws and teachings of our faith fall under these two headings. So if we can master these, we will be in good spiritual shape!

First of all, regarding the love of God, Jesus tells us in essence that we must love God completely and entirely, with our whole being-heart, soul, and mind. If we are holding back from a full commitment to God, then we are falling short of this vision. So we would do well to examine ourselves and find those trouble spots where we are hesitant to give God everything. Is there a relationship we hold in our heart that is somehow separating us from God, either by negative association, lingering bitterness, or a kind of idol-worship of the relationship itself? What about our souls? Are we deeply attached to any pastimes, pleasures, or pursuits that cloud our soul from clearly welcoming the presence of God? An examination of our minds is in order as well. How do we direct our thoughts? Do we strive to form our conscience and understanding in the truth, or do we passively allow public opinion or popular consensus to direct our conclusions about the Church, the world, and our own identity?

It follows that the closer we come to loving God with our whole being, the better we will be at loving our neighbors. The more we are filled with God's love, the more that love radiates out to those around us, and the less we concern ourselves about what we can get out of the deal. So let us truly love God, and all the rest will follow.

How Our Parish Prays



For many years, Bob and Kay Morris had the 10:00-11:00 time slot at Friday's Eucharistic Adoration. However, they often stayed until noon because the experience was so peaceful and without distractions.

Bob brings his folder of 50+ funeral memorial pamphlets, which he saved over the years. One by one he pulls them out, remembers each person, then prays for the person and his or her family.

Every day, Bob and Kay try to ride the exercise bike while praying the Rosary, finding it a good time to concentrate on the prayers of the Rosary while thinking about and praying for the needs of their children and grandchildren. Each evening when they get into bed, they hold hands and pray together the Prayer to Your Guardian Angel.

When they are able, they are at daily Mass. On the way to communion, Bob prays: "Lord have mercy on my past, my present to your love and my future to your providence." Kay's favorite Daily Prayer: I said a prayer for you today and know God must have heard. I felt the answer in my heart although he spoke no word! I didn't ask for wealth or fame, I knew you wouldn't mind. I asked Him to send treasures of a far more lasting kind! I asked that He'd be near you at the start of each new day. To grant you health and blessings and friends to share your way! I asked for happiness for you in all things great and small. But it was for His loving care, I prayed for most of all!

Parish Information


