

#### **Meals for Families**

Life gets busy when a new baby is welcomed into a family — so parishioners provide and deliver 4-5 meals. For families with a newborn or for those experiencing difficulties due to an illness or tragedy, a group of volunteers have offered to provide meals. Parish coordinators work with the volunteers to organize the meal deliveries, based on the needs and special diets of those receiving them. It is a great way to meet other members of our church and to let people know we care about them in their time of need.

"But the wise brought flasks of oil with their lamps." The foolish versus the wise. Today's parable sets these two groups in stark contrast to one another. Two crowds of young women wait for a wedding feast. One group comes prepared for the unexpected, the other just assumes everything will go according to schedule. But it doesn't! The Bridegroom is late, and the foolish virgins are left out in the dark-literally--while the wise ones enjoy the feast inside.

The lesson here is not just about having foresight and gathering the corresponding equipment. It's about being ready for the second coming of Christ. Jesus himself is the "Bridegroom." Traditionally we refer to the Church as the "Bride of Christ" and we, as the people of God who constitute the Church, are even now awaiting the real feast, the culmination of time when Jesus returns. But are we standing among the wise or the foolish as we wait?

Jesus tells us today, "Stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour." Are we spiritually awake? Do we have extra oil to see us through, or are we hitting the bottom of the barrel and running on spiritual fumes so to speak? Do we think it's enough to do the bare minimum as we wait for Christ--stepping into church without really being present, or calling ourselves Christian without really taking up the challenge of the cross? In order to avoid standing outside the feast with the foolish, we will want to make sure we fill our flasks with oil or, in other words, fill our hearts with the love of God, fill our minds with his word and his teachings, and fill our souls with the virtues that unite us to his will. If we stock up on these important supplies, we can count ourselves among the wise!


#### **Annual Diocesan Appeal**



That moment of blessing, however brief, reminds us of our dependence on God for life; it strengthens our feeling of gratitude for the gifts of creation; it acknowledges those who by their labors provide us with these goods; and it reaffirms our solidarity with those in greatest need."(#227)



#### **How Our Parish Prays**

The Chapman Family

It took us a while to get comfortable praying together. We didn't know how to begin or if we were doing it right. We started with the dinner blessing; gradually adding prayer intentions for others. Later, we'd talk about those we prayed for and how we could help them. At night we prayed the Our Father together. Then added other traditional Catholic prayers; sometimes prayers our kids find. For Christmas, Wade made everyone a decade Rosary, which made praying it doable. Now we pray the whole Rosary. When we have nights filled with tension, we stop everything and pray the Rosary together. The Rosary brings us peace and helps us reflect on the life of Christ. By doing these things, the kids recognize what is important; they associate praying with knowing there will be a better outcome. We have religious items like crosses, Rosary bracelets /necklaces with medals, holy water and oils, etc. All of these help us think of the things of heaven and the saints who want to help us.

Sometimes we come to Eucharistic Adoration on Mondays. Being in Jesus' presence helps us decompress and gives Him space to talk to our hearts, putting life into perspective. We'll bring spiritual books or just sit and be still. 15 minutes before heading out for Mass, we read the Scripture we'll hear and discuss it briefly. It helps us know what to expect and be curious about the homily. Wade is part of the Saturday morning prayer group which reads and discusses the upcoming Sunday Gospel; so he'll share those thoughts with our family.

"As a family, you can pray the 'Our Father' around the dinner table. That's not difficult to do, it's easy. Praying the rosary together, as a family is very beautiful and it gives strength. Also praying for one another." -Pope Francis

#### **Parish Information**

Baptism: Parents must be registered members of the parish. Baptism classes are required, ideally before the child is born. Call the parish office to register for classes and to schedule a Baptism 624-2228. No Baptisms are scheduled during Lent.

<u>Marriage</u>: Preparations must be made at least 6 months in advance of the marriage date. No Weddings are scheduled during Lent.

<u>Homebound Communion</u>: Eucharistic Ministers are available to bring Holy Communion to the sick and elderly of the parish. Call the parish office if you would like Communion brought to your home.

<u>Holy Anointing</u>: Do not hesitate to call the parish office in case of serious illness/injury.
