
## **Annual Diocesan Appeal**


## **New Album - Beautiful Savior**

# **How Our Parish Prays**

Praying together was awkward at first. Neither of us grew up in homes that routinely prayed together, unless a response to something bad such as a natural disaster, serious illness, or death of a loved one. This was not how we wanted our family to be so we fought through the awkwardness, and it became easier each time. Now we are intentional about praying together and we don't hesitate to spontaneously stop, hold hands, and pray in times of need or thanksgiving.

During a Marriage on Tap evening at our parish, we learned how to write a simple prayer using the formula: A.C.T.S: Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving, Supplication. We put our responses together into one prayer which we pray together in the morning:

Dear God, You are our strength and our way. Please forgive us for not placing all of our trust in You and for doubting your divine providence. We thank You for everything You have blessed us with and we thank you especially for your protection and peace. We ask that You fill our hearts and our minds with Your peace and that You guide us to serve You in accordance with Your will. Amen.

Before leaving home, the kids are blessed with holy water and in the car I pray aloud: "Thank you God for this beautiful, new day you have given us. Please help us to have good days today. Keep us healthy and strong. Help us to be good friends and have good listening ears. Send down Your Holy Spirit upon us and fill us with the fruits of Your spirit. Amen." I said this one morning after several weeks of behavioral problems at school. Once it became clear this was our new routine, I tried to revise the prayer to sound more graceful, but they refused anything but the original verbiage and point out if I miss anything.

We say grace before meals – whether at home, someone else's house or a restaurant. It's important to us to teach them to give thanks no matter where we might be and to never be ashamed of their Catholic faith. By praying with our kids, even at their young ages, I know they have an idea that there is someone greater out there who loves them and who they can rely on. We want them to know how to talk with God. They will occasionally pray for things on their own. They are often silly or trivial requests (we are doubtful Zeke's regular petition for 'dinosaurs' is making much impact!) but I love knowing they can turn to God with these things.

Recently, we began praying a decade of the Rosary together in bed. By attending the monthly prayer services at Saint Mary's in honor of the 100th anniversary of Mary's appearances in Fatima, we developed a strong admiration and love for Mary. We turn to her and her Rosary for help with our children and family and as a source of compassion and strength.

There is vulnerability in praying out loud with another person and doing so has developed a deep trust and strength in our marriage. Praying together also helps us to focus on God and our family instead of the world around us.

## **Parish Information**

<u>Homebound Communion</u>: Eucharistic Ministers are available to bring Holy Communion to the sick and elderly of the parish. Call the parish office if you would like Communion brought to your home.

<u>Holy Anointing</u>: Do not hesitate to call the parish office in case of serious illness/injury.


