
#### Sacred Relics Of The Saints:

Fr. Carlos Martins will bring with him over 150 relics, some as old as 2000 years. Among the treasures will be relics of St. Maria Goretti, St. Therese of Lisieux, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Anthony of Padua and St. Thomas Aquinas. There will also be one of the largest remaining pieces of the True Cross in the world. We will begin with a presentation in the church and then visit the relics in the hall. In the Church's history many miracles & healings have been worked in the presence of relics, and many have been healed through this ministry.

Bring your articles of devotion (rosaries, holy cards, etc.) and pictures of ill friends/family members, which you will be able to touch to the reliquaries as a means of intercession.





"People of the whole Judean countryside and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem were going out to him." John the Baptist commanded quite a crowd. What was the attraction? Was it his unusual appearance--clothed in camel's hair? Perhaps it was his bizarre eating habits--feeding on locusts and wild honey. Or maybe people were captivated by the Baptist's remarkable humility in the face of such huge popularity--"I am not worthy."

Unlike our modern fascination with standing in the presence of superstars, the crowds who flocked to John weren't looking for a thrill. They weren't lining up for autographs. They were lining up for baptism. And they were acknowledging their sins at the same time. John was proclaiming "a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins." And people came because they were longing to experience the freedom of that forgiveness.

John called them to conversion. To convert means to turn, in this case to turn away from sin. And the crowds were anxious to do so in order to "prepare the way of the Lord." For these first-century Jews, the imminent approach of the Messiah came with a call for conversion and they took this call very seriously.

Now, for us, as twenty-first century Christians, the Church, like John the Baptist, calls us to prepare and repent during this season of Advent. Will we take the call seriously? Will we examine the areas of our lives that need to change? Will we pray for God's help to overcome our habitual sin and to make choices based on generosity instead of selfishness? Now is the time to heed the message. Now is the time to "prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths."

#### **How Our Parish Prays**



Nick and Amber Jedlicka Family

Nick and Amber Jedicka's prayer lives began small and grew over time. Taking part in RCIA before being engaged, they developed a circle of friends who shared a yearning to grow in faith. Later, married with young kids left them and their friends feeling frazzled from life and disconnected from faith. Nick and Amber, along with other couples made a concerted effort to meet monthly to share the struggles and successes of their faith and relationships. They had this couple support for over half of their 14 years of marriage. Prayer became an ever increasing priority as they realized the profound difference it was making in the strength of their marriage and family.

Prayer time now involves four children ages 3 to 11. Attending weekly Mass as a family is priority one. Family meal prayer is a constant and centers on a prayer rock. As the rock is passed around, the person can share a prayer of thanksgiving or intention; a high/low from their day or something hoped for. The tradition has become so ingrained, the kids anticipate it, rushing to the table to be the first to share. Recently, Nick and Amber weren't able to join them right away. At the table by themselves, they self-initiated the passing of the prayer rock. Sophia, the three year old has always participated, even when just learning to talk in jumbled words. Now she often comes up with the most thoughtful and original prayers. The kids will often reiterate the prayers they heard mom and dad lift up the evening before.

In the mornings, they don't leave for the bus until mom makes the sign of the cross on their forehead saying: "God be with you and shine through you." In the evenings, the older girls have their own prayer routines, while Jack and Dad kneel on opposite sides of his bed for an Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be. And then Nick kneels by his own bedside, motivated to pray in thanksgiving for their many and the many needs of others. Recently, he found himself praying as he woke up-nothing he set out to do, but it just flowed naturally from the night before.

With the season of Advent brings the Wreath with candles to light at dinner and Nativity Sets with figures to interact with as the story of Christmas is shared. The season reminds them to be intentional about slowing down and being present and engaged in what the kids are doing... especially the things that seem small and trivial. A trip to the tree farm should include the popcorn, hot chocolate, pictures, meandering. They try to do the same with their time in prayer – not rush through it, but truly be present and engaged with God our Father.

#### **Parish Information**
