





SCRIPTURE MEDITATION

(Jerry Galipeau, World Library Publications) Because the feast of the Presentation of the Lord was celebrated last Sunday, we missed hearing the Gospel of Matthew.

Last week's Gospel was the beginning of the Sermon on the Mount, presenting the Beatitudes. This sermon will go on for the next four weeks. But then we will miss the ending of the entire sermon (Matthew 5-7). It is the first of five great speeches Jesus gives in Matthew's Gospel. It is our agenda as the children of the kingdom of heaven, offering a blueprint for the transformation of the world. Jesus' words today follow immediately after the Beatitudes. When we live out of or into the blessed state of being poor in spirit, mourning the pain and suffering of the world, being meek, hungering and thirsting for justice, being merciful, pure of heart, peacemakers, and persecuted for the sake of righteousness, then we are salt that seasons and preserved life. Then we are the light that casts out the darkness and draws others to glorify God.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

n this weekend's readings and psalm, the prevailing theme is that of light: We are the light of the world; our light

breaks forth like the dawn; our light shines in the darkness; our light reflects generosity and justice. Good stewards know they are the lamp. and Christ is the flame that, through them, illumi-nates the earth. They know that they carry Christ's light in their hearts, and let it shine through their words and deeds. What are we doing to shine Christ's light on the hungry, the homeless and others most in need of God's mercy? How do we exercise good stewardship over the light of Christ that burns within each of us?
