SCRIPTURE MEDITATION



(Jerry Galipeau, World Library Publications) God often works through human thirst. When the Israelites grew thirsty in the desert, they began to complain that Moses had led them out there to die. Not a little exasperated.

Moses moved the complaint up the line to God, who had been directing the Exodus event from the beginning. To make the point that God can, does, and will provide, God has Moses tap water from a rock. The complaining stopped, for the time being. Thirst brought the Samaritan woman to a well at noon. She thought the only water she was going to get was when she could put in her bucket. Like the people in the desert, she found the rock of our salvation, waiting to slake her deepest thirst. The One who first asked her for a drink ended up being the source of living water, welling up to eternal life. This water was hers for the asking and she drank it in. Notice how she moves from seeing Jesus simply as a thirsty Jew, to acknowledging him as a prophet, to knowing him as the Messiah. In the end the entire village knows him as "the savior of the world."
