### **SCRIPTURE MEDITATION**

(Jerry Galipeau, World Library Publications) All four Gospels have the Easter story, beginning with a visit to the tomb. Usually someone is waiting there to announce that Jesus has been raised. Only John's

Gospel offers no announcement. Instead, some clues suggest this has happened: the stone blocking the entrance has been rolled back, the body of Jesus is not there, the burial clothes are there but separate from the cloth that covered his face. John's Gospel is a book of signs clues, if you will - that the author sets out to help us discover who Jesus is. The cloth that covered Jesus' face, now lying separate, is seen as offering the "aha" moment, signaling that Jesus has been raised. Biblical scholars make a connection with Moses, who would cover his face with a veil after talking with God on Mount Sinai because it shone so brightly that it frightened the people, then remove the veil when talking with God. The face cloth neatly folded in the tomb signals that Jesus is now in the presence of the Father, and no longer needs to conceal his divinity. The beloved disciple is the only one who reads the clues; he has "Easter eyes" and sees with faith.
