

St. Mary Cemetery Committee has been planning improvements to our beloved St. Mary Cemetery. The improvements will be completed in 4 phases. Phase I will include the construction of a new archway with the old stained-glass transom window from the church entrance, the original old church cross mounted, and St. Mary prominently placed. Phase II includes a 6 ft statue of St. Mary with 2-4 benches being placed in the general vicinity. Also, 4 memorial corner posts, marking the former 4 foundation corner locations, will be constructed. Phase III includes construction of sidewalk including a stair/ramp/sidewalk plan making the cemetery accessible to handicapped persons from Cedar St. Phase IV includes the construction of a columbarium retaining wall along the entire south and part of the west former foundation wall for a future columbarium. Parishioners and family members will have the opportunity to help preserve the cemetery and memorialize their loved ones.

The donation and placarding plan is meant to generate enough revenue for purchase, placement of items, foundations and structures with residual income/donations being utilized toward, lights, sidewalks, flag posts, etc. The committee will accept any donation amount toward any improvement/addition; however, only donations of \$1,000 or greater will have their name or the name of their family added to a placard.


Gospel Meditation 6th SUNDAY

We may not like it, but generosity and risk often go hand-in-hand. At least, that's what Jesus shows us in today's Gospel as a leper approaches him for healing. Until the nineteenth century, lepers were shunned to the margins of society for fear of spreading the disease. To touch a leper was to risk becoming unclean yourself. In today's Gospel, Jesus defies convention. "Moved with pity, he reached out his hand, [and] touched him." The leper is healed! But this is not the only risk Jesus takes.

Before Jesus heals the man, he knows full well the desperate nature of his situation. Jesus knows that this man will be overjoyed upon being healed and that he just might tell everyone he knows. For a Messiah looking to temporarily fly under the radar, healing this particular leper might not be the best idea. Jesus heals anyway.

It can be easy to become calculated in our giving. If I go out of my way to help this person, how will it affect my reputation? How will this charitable donation affect my budget? How could I possibly make time to volunteer regularly? In today's Gospel, Jesus casts these concerns aside. He touches the untouchable. He reaches the unreachable. For his efforts, he receives a betrayal of his request for silence. "The man went away and began to publicize the whole matter." Before long "it was impossible for Jesus to enter a town openly." Jesus is forced to remain "outside in the deserted places." It would appear, perhaps, that he is unable to accomplish his mission.

When we take a risk to be generous, things might not follow the prescribed path. We might be disappointed. We also might be surprised! Our witness to radical generosity is attractive to a world in desperate need. Indeed, when Jesus took risks for love, "People kept coming to him from everywhere."




DATE NIGHT: Saturday, Feb. 17th 6-8:30 pm



How Our Parish Prays



Gwen and Mark Prentice

In 2011, Gwen and Mark felt called to join the 40 Days for Life Prayer Campaigns, taking place in the fall and Lent. Having long-held pro-life convictions, with a great love for women in a crisis pregnancy and for their unborn children, Gwen felt compelled to pray in earnest for them, after reading Abby Johnson's book Unplanned. It is Abby's compelling story from both sides of the abortion clinic property line: going from director of a Planned Parenthood Clinic, to one of the nation's leading voices for life and women in crisis.

The first year Gwen felt uneasy going to Emma Goldman to pray, so she prayed daily with the email reflections from 40 Days (40daysforlife.com/devotionals). For the next campaign - she made the decision to not be afraid to go and pray at the clinic. Walking to it was hard, standing there the first several minutes was uncomfortable, but soon the hope and peace came. There is no protesting with loud words and ugly signs; it is a prayerful presence of lifting up God's children who are in need. A few rude comments are made occasionally—but overwhelmingly people who drive by are encouraging. Mark soon joined in, as did their kids who were in high school at the time. Even though Gwen and Jill joined hundreds of thousands in Washington, DC for the March for Life, they wanted their children to know and pray for what is taking place 10 miles to the south of us.

Like Mark and Gwen, after reading the book Unplanned, many have been inspired to join in the peaceful prayer campaign that is 40 Days for Life. Just as the prayers of many helped Abby make the courageous decision to leave the abortion industry - the fruit of 40 Days is the closing of many abortion clinics and the conversions of those in them, along with the greatest fruit: lives saved and women experiencing the joys of motherhood.




