Iowa City Free Lunch Program



Our parish prepares and serves the meal at the **Free Lunch Program**, located at 1105 Gilbert Ct in Iowa City, on the 1st Friday of odd numbered months. 2018 dates are: March 2, May 4, July 6, Sept 7, and Nov 2. Volunteers can help:


- assist the day of the meal with food prep, serving the meal, or cleaning up
- prepare food ahead of time (salads or other misc. requests)
- eat and interact with guests

If interested, let the parish office know and you will be included in emails sent out 1-2 weeks prior to each meal. The emails include an online sign-up form. Shifts are typically 9:30am-noon (food prep) OR 11:45am-1:30pm serving and cleanup. Volunteer when you're available--anywhere from 1-6x/year. Meals are served cafeteria style and guests go through the line with their plates. Our volunteers dish up all the food and then do dishes and cleanup afterwards.




Why do we always go to the desert? We see this example in Scripture time and time again. The Israelites wandered in the desert. King David and prophets were driven into the wilderness. And now Jesus is in the same place. Lent after Lent, we too are invited into a barren, desolate place. Why do we always go to the desert?


Throughout Scripture, the desert is a place of testing. It's also a place of hiding and withdrawal. In the Old Testament, David fled into the wilderness to hide from Saul, Elijah from Jezebel, and Jonah from God! In other words, the desert is a place of "retreat." In Christian circles, we use the word to describe a spiritual weekend away. But its meaning comes from warfare, as we well know. To retreat means to draw back, to separate oneself from the fighting. Of course, a military retreat brings its own kind of "battle" - the internal assessment of why the fighting went so poorly.

As we enter into this Lenten season, we are invited to retreat into the desert with Jesus. Attending a day or weekend of reflection is a wonderful spiritual practice. This "desert spirituality," however, can fill all forty days. We can fulfill our Lenten resolutions with a purpose - writing daily notes to family and friends can inspire new gratitude, every time we pass up that specific food item can be cause for intercession for deeper sufferings and privations of others.

The Gospel tells us that "the Spirit drove him out into the desert." In other words, God wants us to be here. What feels uncomfortable is actually part of our spiritual journey. To be stretched, to be challenged, to confront our own areas of weakness - these things are essential in our walk with God. This Lent, will you go to the desert?





How Our Parish Prays



Adam, Emma, Molly, Owen, Brian, Caleb & Hannah Bock

As Christianity becomes increasingly counter cultural, Brian and Molly realize that if their children are going to know Christ and center their lives on him, they have to be increasingly intentional. Brian wants Sunday to be for faith and family. They never miss Mass; no matter what state or whether traveling for vacation or sports, going is nonnegotiable. And they like their kids seeing the celebration of the Mass is universal. When in town, they try to keep Sundays free from electronics and restricted use of bedrooms, so they can "be" together.

Molly receives the daily email reflections from BlessedisShe.net and also from DynamicCatholic.com; the later contains an image and inspirational quote. Every couple of weeks she prints one for the fridge, currently it's a quote from Mother Theresa. They joked, "our water dispenser is slow, so it gives our kids time to read and think about it." Three years ago during Lent, Molly began praying the Rosary for her family and others on her work commute. It was a peaceful way to begin her day: bringing clarity, things went more smoothly and patiently. She has continued it, year-round ever since. She has shelves full of Catholic books, finding the more you read spiritual and inspirational books, you don't even want to pick up other books.

During Advent and Lent, the family has taken on a tradition that was in Molly's mother's home while growing up: praying 1,000 Hail Marys. Since 2016, a tally sheet goes up on the fridge during those seasons of the church to keep count as they are prayed. While they pray regularly before meals and have religious images throughout their house, they are also an active part of their parish family. Even with five kids, they prioritize in their family's time, the opportunities to participate in retreats, conferences, study groups and communal prayer such as Eucharistic Adoration on Mondays, parish reconciliation services and Stations of the Cross during Lent. Sometimes life gets busy, they get a little off track, but they keep coming back and reorienting their family around Christ.
