
You opened yourself to God's word and the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us.

# **Gospel Meditation**



The Ascension is an interesting feast when you think about it. We celebrate Jesus leaving! Jesus' first departure from the earth was sudden and unexpected, at least to his followers. That Good Friday departure was characterized by sorrow, confusion, and loss. This departure has a different feel: anticipation.

Today's Gospel is full of the mighty deeds Jesus predicts for his followers. "In my name they will drive out demons, they will speak new languages. They will pick up serpents [with their hands], and if they drink any deadly thing it will not harm them. They will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover." Mark's account of the Ascension is abrupt and succinct. "Then the Lord Jesus, after he spoke to them, was taken up into heaven." Jesus ascends and the Apostles go. "But they went forth and preached everywhere." The real moment likely had a bit of lag time. Realistically, the Apostles had quite the task in front of them. Can you imagine those first few moments on the hilltop after Jesus disappeared, as the Apostles met each other's eyes? "This is it. He really is gone this time. It's up to us now."

Mark's abrupt transition from Ascension to action makes his meaning clear. The Ascension isn't just about Jesus. It's about us. Are we ready to go? Are we ready to be commissioned? This is the heart of the Ascension message -Jesus leaves so we can go. We might not "go into the whole world," but we all live in a corner of it. The command to "proclaim the Gospel" isn't a call for everyone to be formal preachers of the Word. We do, however, proclaim our beliefs with the way we live our lives. Do our lives proclaim Easter joy?

# **How Our Parish Prays**

What can young families on the go, do to ground their children in a love for their Catholic faith? Invite Tiny Thomist to dinner! Marty discovered this free bi-weekly publication at dominicaninstitute.com The resources help engage their children's faith. At dinner, they use "saintly situations"; stories that spark conversations about living with virtue.

The day begins in prayer on the ride to school: asking God for help, thanking him and lifting up other's needs. It ends in bedtime prayer-St. Michael prayer is a recent favorite; thinking the boys may be drawn by images of swords and winning battles. They used saintsnamegenerator.com to receive a patron saint for the year. They've been learning about their four saints, turn to them for prayer and celebrate their feast days.

Recently Marty and Jessie prayed together the Novena to Divine Mercy, but schedules led them to develop personal routines. Last August, Marty began a 54 day Rosary Novena for the Holy Father. He began praying it with the Relevant Radio app on his way to work. Several days in, he wanted to give it more attention. Ever since, he gets up 20 minutes early to pray it as an act of sacrifice and discipline. Marty meets at 6:30am on Saturdays for the parish's Fishers of Men prayer group. He invites others to join the conversation about the Gospel, in a way men can connect. Favorite podcasts include: The Liturgy Guys; Pints with Aquinas; & Catholic Stuff You Should Know.

Jessie has her favorite podcasts/videos too: Edward Sri, Fr. Mike Schmitz and Danielle Bean. Her day begins with the scripture and meditations in the WORD Among Us and the book Catholic Mom's Prayer Companion. These help direct her thoughts in positive ways and put life as a mother into perspective. She is currently reading the Diary of Sister Faustina, learning about God's merciful love as Jesus revealed to Faustina. On Fridays she comes for Eucharistic Adoration; leaving distractions at home to spend time in silence with Jesus.

Earlier in their marriage – prayer consisted of meal time grace. But as they're increasingly drawn to Christ and living as his disciples, they know intentional time set aside to be with God, is not optional. And as prayer became routine, they've noticed things changed: within their hearts and their outlook on life, and they see God at work in their lives and in those they are praying for.


