Gospel Meditation



Today we celebrate the "birthday of the Church!"

Pentecost is described in the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles. But before the great driving wind and tongues of fire empowering the Disciples, the Holy Spirit had already arrived. The Gospel for today's Mass during the day is from John 20. Jesus appears to the fearful disciples after his resurrection. He first speaks a message of calm. "Peace be with you." The apostles "rejoiced when they saw the Lord." When the enthusiastic response settles down, Jesus "breathed on them and said to them 'Receive the Holy Spirit."

This action is Trinitarian, and it has happened before. If you turn your Bible back to the beginning, you'll read: "The Lord God formed man out of the clay of the ground and blew into his nostrils the breath of life, and so many became a living being" (Genesis 2:7). In the Garden of Eden, we see God's first, original covenant with man. The breath of life signifies that original indwelling of grace, the special state of likeness and friendship with God before the Fall. Here now, in this locked room, the Apostles receive the long-awaited promise: the very breath of God, new life, a new covenant.

In the pairing of these two readings-the Pentecost experience in Acts and the breath of Jesus in John's Gospel -we see that the coming of the Holy Spirit is not only an empowering, it is an indwelling. We have each received the breath of grace in our baptism. It is confirmed, strengthened, and deepened in each reception of the sacraments. If we persevere in virtue, the Spirit of God is alive in us, inspiring our actions of love. This Pentecost Sunday, how is the breath of God alive in you?




Mary Our Mother



How Our Parish Prays



Heading off to college? Raiden suggests finding a Catholic Community. Start going to Mass and get involved in one thing. If they offer a retreat—try to attend one each year. He has many secular friends - but finding people who are good and holier than him, has proved invaluable. For two years he's lived in a Catholic men's house; with guys who challenge and support one another in becoming the men God intends. Morning Prayer at 6:45 uses liturgy of the hours (laudate or ibeveriary apps) and ends with Praise and Worship, which Raiden leads bi- weekly. Offering their day to God puts life into perspective (which anyone can do upon waking): 'Lord you are constant, you are faithful; I want to live for you today, help me be faithful.'

On his own, he prays with the daily Mass readings. A priest shared it is important to pray, in your personal life, with the daily scripture the universal church is praying with. Raiden puts himself in the shoes of someone in the story. Or he'll re-read a passage listening for a word or phrase that resonates. His current schedule doesn't allow for daily Mass – but he has two weekly adoration slots-providing a quiet escape from the noise of college life. He enters prayer without an agenda – just to hear God's voice give clarity to his life. Raiden writes music and will ask "Lord, what do you want to say through this song?" During Lent he was drawn to Jeremiah and Isaiah – especially Isaiah 45 upon which he wrote a song titled, "There is no God but You."

Raiden looks to Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati, as a role model, a young man who unashamedly lived his Catholic faith and life to the fullest. Giorgio was selfless as he served the poor and sick; and confident and bold as he encouraged friends to live their faith. With so many around us living in spiritual poverty, he asks God to give him a heart to love them. Raiden desires to spend his life like St. John Paul II and Giorgio, being selflessly present to people God puts in his life, leading them to Jesus.

Of the Trinity – Raiden feels closest to the Father, sharing: I love the Father! He is so good. He knows my heart. He knows what and when I need to hear things. The Father keeps me grounded and when I spend time with him I find I am less shaken by the things of this world: grades, annoying things etc. He reveals himself to me, who I am as his son and what things he has for me to do. By him we are loved in an unfathomable way – and this makes everything else pale in comparison. As Saint John Paul II says: "We are not the sum of our weaknesses and failures; we are the sum of the Father's love for us."


