- 1. COVID update Diocese -
 - We are still in Stage 2 and waiting for vaccine to make a difference. We received an update from the diocese allowing cantors to do more for services. Will work to get cantors and accompanists rescheduled.
 - New video equipment is in use starting today. It is much better than before. Many more capabilities for the parish for many celebrations, etc.
 - Per couple in **Germany**! new camera angle & view are much better. Nice to have readings on screen.
 - Going to need to possibly train more people to run the controls.
 - Were able to hold a Baptism where godmother is in service in Qatar. Great grandparents were able to watch the baptism at home. Took a family picture together with those online on the big screen.
 - Two notes from California have 2 couples viewing from there who are grateful to have found our Masses online.

- F. Schedule communication: Nichole is taking care of getting full schedule in bulletin for Advent & Christmas events. Also creating mailings, no newspaper ad, will do bulletin inserts.

8. Christmas

- A. Service dates and times and locations
 - i. Christmas Eve:
 - Drive in Masses at 5 PM and 7 PM at auditorium.
 - Father will offer Mass in front of big glass windows in lobby of theater.
 - Also on FM station and will be streamed on FB too.
 - Sending out a hard copy to everyone. Father will address in upcoming Masses.
 - If possible, have KC's and/or ushers park cars. 300 stalls available. Can see from all parking spots. Father will talk to Knights. (Dennis Uhl and John Donatelly.) June will also email Mark Roskopf. Would be nice to have knights to direct traffic for parking.
 - 8 EMCH's needed to go to parking area and distribute to the cars. Will send emails with sign up genius. Also Father will mention in masses and send messages out with bulleting. Try to get 8 for the parking lot. We will have 1 EMHC on each side of car and distribute to 2 rows of cars at a time. Send out folks in pairs. If fewer cars, work it out.
 - Will need one lector for each Mass. Will send emails.
 - Father has sent request for usage form to the school. Waiting for approval.
 - Chuck will talk to Keith Duster (SCSD Technical director) if needed. Need to find out bandwidth that can be used to not interfere with law enforcement, etc.
 - Choir will likely be behind father at theater. Chuck will work out logistics.

- As much as possible will be sung. Gloria, etc.
- Will have as much music as possible for the Masses. Will keep choir socially distant.
- Decorations 2 Christmas banners on side windows, 1 tree?, 4 big poinsettias. June working with Keith Duster to determine when we can get in to set up. Need to determine a time and day to get everything over to PAC that is needed.
- Deacons and Father will take care of getting everything needed for the Eucharist and celebration of Christmas Eve Mass. June will send list to Father and the Deacons.
- ii. Christmas Day Mass Will be 9 AM at the church.
 - Will livestream if possible.
 - Will need 3 ushers for 9 AM Christmas Day Mass. 1 EMHC, 1 Lector. Will send emails

B. Misc.

- No 2nd collection for Christmas flowers this year.
- No books or gift bags given out this year. No carolers this year.
- Chuck will take care of music and choirs and follow guidelines.

C. Christmas decorating

- Have a couple who is interested in being in charge of Christmas decorating.
- June to work with Nichole and new couple or others.
- Minimal decorations this year.

2 nativity sets – one in church and big one outside if possible.

Inside church – Suggest doing big trees. And the big wreaths. Also will put banners up. Gathering space - just one decorated tree, one giving tree.

- Poinsettias on order: 2 big ones for church, 4 for PAC. June will get those to church.
- We can have a group do decorating. Will put out messages for help for after 5 pm mass on 12/20. June will work on getting volunteers for that and check with folks who have helped in previous years.

Was hoping for more folks but it was very cold, and covid numbers up from Thanksgiving. It all came together.

B. Decorating was minimal this year, but enough folks showed up to help. Takedown done on 01/10 and plenty of folks showed up. Emails to the KC's and announcements at masses helped. June elated at all folks who stuck around to help. Young families got involved.

3. Licensing for reprinting readings, and Youtube rules. See attached Liturgy notes.

Chuck will check with Nichole regarding OCP and printing requirements to make sure we are covered. If we have hymnals we are allowed to print as many copies as we have hymnals. We don't do anything on Youtube so that's not an issue.

- b. February 2: World Day for Consecrated Life,
- c. February 2 will have a candle Mass to get candles blessed time TBA.
- d. February 3: St. Blaise blessing of throats should be avoided this year according to liturgy notes. Instead, priests may want to use the blessing formula as a prayer over the people to close the general intercessions.
- e. February 7 14 National Marriage Week
- f. February 14 World Day of Marriage (Sunday)
- g. Februrary 14 KC's thinking of doing something special for Valentines....donuts, etc.
- h. March 6-7 Safe Haven Sunday

5. Beginning of Lent - Ash Wednesday - February 17

- a. Will we do ashes this year? If so, how? This will be discussed in staff and communicated to committee. From Liturgy Notes: As with the blessing of throats, in order to avoid prolonged time together as well as proximity, consideration should be given to omitting the imposition of ashes this year. If ashes are to be imposed, consider the following:
 - 1. Say the formula once over the assembly, so there is no talking while in proximity.
 - 2. Use an instrument to impose the ashes or, following careful catechesis, sprinkle the ashes on the top of the head. See below for a sample bulletin insert, courtesy of Eliot Kapitan (adapted).
 - 3. Consider imposing the ashes outdoors (weather permitting), as people leave the church after the liturgy, rather than within Mass.
 - 4. Consider celebrating the imposition of ashes outside of Mass (see the Book of Blessings,

#1656ff). A deacon may preside at this rite (and bless the ashes); a lay person may lead this rite, using ashes blessed on a previous occasion (but no "drive through" ashes divorced from a celebration of the word).

- b. day of fast and abstinence (Fasting- One regular meal two lighter meals and Abstinence of Meat)
- c. Do we need to collect old palms for burning? If so request in mass announcements & bulletin)

 None needed this year. Can still bring back get basket put in gathering.
- d. Mass times will have same as last year:
 - i. 6:45 AM Mass
 - ii. 12:00 noon Scripture and Distribution of Ashes
 - iii. 6:30 PM Mass
- e. Will need extra chairs set up for evening mass.
- f. Care Center receipt of ashes in light of Covid? Father will discuss with care center.
- g. No ad in Economist for Ash Wednesday services this year.
- h. Deacon Mitch will be here for all Masses. At 6:30 will also need 1 eucharist minister (to also do ashes) and a lector.

6. Lent

- a. 1st Sunday of Lent February 21 Rite of Election to be celebrated within parishes this year. We may have possibly 1 candidate.
- b. 2nd Sunday of Lent February 28 Penitential Rite for Candidates
- c. 3rd Sunday of Lent March 7 First Scrutiny of the Elect
- d. 4th Sunday of Lent March 14 Second Scrutiny of the Elect (Daylight Savings Time)
- e. 5th Sunday of Lent March 21 Third Scrutiny of the Elect
- f. Chrism Mass tentatively scheduled for March 29. More information to follow on distribution of oils.
- g. Holy oils usually taken care of by Mary Knight. Will need a new volunteer. Will search for one.
- h. No anointing at any Lenten masses this year.
- i. 150 Black books have been ordered for this year. Many folks like them.
- j. Stations of the Cross Will have after every Mass again this Lent. Father will check with Chuck to see if we can project prayers for folks to follow.

- I. Easter flowers (extra collections or ask for donations?) mention in bulletin and at masses would appreciate extra donations for flowers and can be given as a memorial if desired.
